Online Pupil Survey

The Online Pupil Survey is designed to find out what children and young people between the ages of 8 and 18 really think about a range of issues, including:

- healthy eating
- physical activity and sleeping
- school experience including bullying
- vulnerable behaviour & sexual health
- safety & self-harm
- mental health
- future aspirations

We have run the Online Pupil Survey in Gloucestershire every 2 years since 2006. Our survey in 2016 had over 30,000 responses. Overall we have a database of over 120,000 responses over the last 10 years. We are also working with other Local Authorities to build up similar data resources.

Our online data reporting and visualisation tool, **Lodeseeker™**, is used by individual schools to target areas of improvement and to demonstrate to OFSTED how they are actively monitoring performance and listening to Pupil Voice and is used at County level by the Local Authority and Public Health to address areas of need and to target resources more effectively.

Lodeseeker™ offers many different types of reports, from County overviews to detailed drill-downs and from current behaviours to longitudinal trends.

The survey takes about 20-30 minutes, is designed to be bright, interesting and easy to understand. Survey access is via school-level login which ensures individual pupil anonymity. There are different designs and wordings depending on age and setting (Primary, Secondary, Sixth form and FE colleges, Special schools).
